

Student Example

Once a student is logged in (See <u>Pathblazer Student Log In)</u>, the student dashboard will appear.




Students will click on either Pathblazer Reading, or Pathblazer Math to begin.

Once in Reading (Language Arts) or Math, assignments given by the teacher will appear.


NOTE: All science, social studies, Quaver(music), and MyOn will be under the Pathblazer Reading Button.

Math Example:



Students will begin on the designated assignment and work through the lessons, always starting with the lesson with the "snowflake".

EXAMPLE:



When the lesson opens up, students will see a blue "Go" button. Click that button and work through the lessons.



When a lesson is completed, students will click the Exit button and be taken back to the dashboard. The next lesson is ready (with the snowflake).









<u>DISCLAIMER: When the weekly assignment from the teacher is completed,</u>


<u>Pathbalzer will automatically assign other content. These are not district</u>

EXAMPLE:

Click the link, and log in to the site that comes up (<u>Student Log in Sheet</u>) Complete the assignment as directed.

The Portfolio button shows:

- Recent Work
- Assignments
- Reports

The Gradebook button shows:

- Status of assignments
- Date completed
- Score (if applicable)

The ToolKit button shows:


• Helpful tools that are available to use

Message Center/Email:

The mail button is where students will receive and send messages to their teacher.
